

AKIO Morita, MD, PhD is a Japanese Neurosurgeon, born in 1957 in Saitama, Japan. After graduating University of Tokyo, School of Medicine, he joined Dept. of Neurosurgery at the University of Tokyo and trained under Profs. Keiji Sano, Kintomo Takakura, Takanori Fukushima, Tomio Sasaki and Takaaki Kirino. After completing his residency at the University of Tokyo, he became clinical fellow and later resident fellow of the department of Neurological Surgery at the Mayo Clinic. He studied multi-subspecialty neurosurgical fields and was trained under Profs. Thoralf M. Sundt, David G. Piegras, Robert Coffey, Michel J. Ebersold, Richard Marsh, and Burton Onofrio. He completed residency at Mayo Clinic in 1996 and become an assistant professor at the George Washington University, DC under Prof. Laligam N. Sekhar. He experienced many complicated skull base surgeries. In 1998, he returned to University of Tokyo and became an Assistant Professor and later Associate Professor there in 2002. He specialized in Cranial Base Surgery and Vascular Surgery and performed more than 5,000 surgeries in his life. As an academic achievement, he studied robotic medical engineering and clinical studies of vascular pathologies including Japanese cohort study of unruptured cerebral aneurysms (UCAS Japan). His peer review publication list counts more than 200 including 2 articles in New Engl J. Med and 1 article in Lancet Neurol and Total Impact Factor is over 600.
