

Nima Etminan is a Professor of Neurosurgery. He trained in Neurosurgery at the Department of Neurosurgery in Düsseldorf, Germany from 2005-2009. Early on in his residency he had a strong clinical and scientific interest in cerebrovascular disease, under mentorship of Hans-Jakob Steiger and Daniel Hänggi. From 2009-2010 he joined Loch Macdonald as a clinical fellowship in cerebrovascular surgery at St. Michael's Hospital, Toronto, (University of Toronto), which was the fundament for his subsequent clinical and scientific development. In 2010 he accepted the position as an Attending Neurosurgeon in Düsseldorf, Germany and completed his Habilitation in 2013 under the title 'Pathophysiology of intracranial aneurysms and aneurysmal subarachnoid hemorrhage'. In 2015 he joined his long-term mentor and friend Daniel Hänggi (Chair, Department of Neurosurgery, Medical Faculty Mannheim, University of Heidelberg) as Vice Chair of the Department of Neurosurgery, Medical Faculty Mannheim, University of Heidelberg. His surgical expertise lies in cerebrovascular, skull base surgery and neurooncology.

His research focuses on pathogenesis and management of unruptured intracranial aneurysms and aneurysmal subarachnoid hemorrhage. He is the co-PI of the ongoing PROTECT-U trial, the currently largest RCT in patients with unruptured intracranial aneurysms ([www.protect-u-trial.com](http://www.protect-u-trial.com)). His scientific work has been published in >60 publications. Nima Etminan is the co-chair of the 15<sup>th</sup> International Conference on Subarachnoid Hemorrhage.
